A delegation of Arabic speaking legal professionals will be in Central Ohio from March 4-9, 2004. The program, being coordinated locally by the International Visitors Council, Inc. and nationally by the Mississippi Consortium for International Development, is designed to provide participants with an increased understanding of the programs, initiatives and people shaping the doctrinal and practical discussion of law in America.

IVC's mission is to build partnerships between Central Ohioans and citizens of other countries that strengthen democratic ideals, encourage economic development, and promote cultural understanding through the exchange of ideas and knowledge.

BACKGROUND

Most people agree that for a variety of historical, political and economic reasons, the legal systems in a significant number of Arab states don't vet comport with emerging global rule of law ideals. In some states, there is insufficient adherence to United Nations human rights agreements. This program is designed to suggest models for reforms in legal training, doctrine and infrastructure. We hope the participants will leave the U.S. with new ideas that may in time help to create conditions conducive to social and political stability. economic opportunity, sustained peace, and regional development.

Columbus, with its wealth of resources for programs dealing with the concepts of *Rule of Law* and *Judicial Reform*, was selected to feature opportunities for primary-source in-the-field exploration of

the major issues driving U.S. legal policy and judicial reform in addition to traditionally structured meetings and briefings.
